- The geography curriculum has been designed so that all children focus on locational knowledge first as part of each lesson, enabling children to gain a deeper understanding of where places are in the world. This prepares them to delve deeper into place knowledge and human and physical geography, so that more meaningful connections can be made.
- Curriculum is designed for each year group to ensure pupils learning is age appropriate and linked to the wider world.
- Cross curricular links are embedded, with career and cultural capital links mapped across each year group.
- Local context links are identified across the curriculum.
